IN RE: HB1752 by Davis, John (Relating to the regulation of germicidal treatment of certain bedding, materials, and upholstered items.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require that individuals with permits for the germicidal treatment of certain bedding, materials, and upholstered items maintain their places of business in a sanitary condition free from refuse, dirt contamination, insects, and vermin. The Executive Commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission may establish additional requirements regulating the sanitary condition of a permit holder's place of business.

DSHS could absorb any increased administrative activity related to implementing the bill within existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
