IN RE: HB1871 by Keel (Relating to creating an offense for the unauthorized operation of a recording device in a motion picture theater.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would create as a State Jail felony the act of operating an audiovisual recording device in a motion picture theater, screening room, or other place primaily used to exhibit a motion picture. The bill would take effect September 1, 2005.

No significant fiscal implication is anticipated for the enforcement, prosecution, or punishment associated with the offense.

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
