IN RE: HB1924 by Chavez (Relating to the certification of certain health organizations by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners.), Committee Report 1st House, Substituted

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Occupations Code relating to public entity qualified health centers located along the Texas-Mexico border. It is assumed that any work resulting from the passage of the bill could be reasonably absorbed within current resources.
