IN RE: HB2420 by Chavez (Relating to the allocation of federal funds directed to be used to support graduate medical education in connection with the state Medicaid program.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require the Health and Human Services Commission to recognize the growth in residency training slots since 1997 in the Lower Rio Grande Valley and other health care shortage areas of the state.

The effective date is September 1, 2005.

Local Government Impact
