IN RE: HB2692 by Gallego (Relating to the state's goal for electric generating capacity by renewable energy technologies and distributed renewable energy generation.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The Public Utility Commission indicates any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

Local Government Impact

It is anticipated that there would be no direct local government impact as a result of the bill, although local tax bases in counties with substantial development of renewable energy generation resources could increase with the development of more renewable energy generation projects.
