**IN RE: HB2875** by Solis (Relating to a statutory probate court judge's authority to transfer certain proceedings from another court to the statutory probate court and to the venue for certain actions brought by or against a guardian, executor, or other personal representative.),  
**Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

This bill would allow a statutory probate court to transfer certain cause of actions relating to estates from a court to the statutory probate court even if venue for the action is proper or mandatory in the county of the court from which the action is to be transferred.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
