**IN RE: HB3010** by Grusendorf (Relating to the transfer of a failure to attend school proceeding to juvenile court.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted** 

## No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would prohibit a juvenile court from refusing to accept the transfer of a Failure to Attend School case for certain children if a prosecuting attorney for the court determines that the case is legally sufficient under Section 53.01, Family Code. The bill would take effect September 1, 2005.
