IN RE: HB3115 by Corte (Relating to certain homeland security activities, including the operation of the Critical Infrastructure Protection Council by the office of the governor.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would modify the composition and duties of the Critical Infrastructure Protection Council in the Office of the Governor. The bill would permit the Office of the Governor to allocate available federal and state grants to private entities that perform homeland security activities. The bill would allow for council members to be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performing their duties relating to council activities.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
