**IN RE: HB3163** by Noriega, Melissa (Relating to the membership of the Texas Military Preparedness Commission.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill increases the Texas Military Preparedness Commission from 9 to 13 public members and that members serve staggered terms of six years with the terms of four or five members expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
