**IN RE: HB3284** by Guillen (Relating to requiring voter approval for certain rate increases by water and sewer utilities.), **As Introduced** 

## No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would prohibit a water or sewer utility from cumulatively increasing rates by 25 percent or more in a calendar year, except if the increase is necessary to ensure the provision of continuous and adequate services; otherwise, a majority of the members/customers in the water or sewer utility affected by the proposed rate increase would have to vote to approve the increase. The bill would take effect September 1, 2005.

## Local Government Impact

Based on data submitted by various local government entities to the Secretary of State in March 2004, the average cost per registered voter for an election is \$1.29. The cost would vary by utility and would depend on the number of voters affected.
