IN RE: SB1100 by Deuell (Relating to the promotion of tourism related to the musical heritage of this state.), **As Engrossed**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill requires the music office within the Governor's Office to develop a Texas Music History Tour program to promote and preserve Texas music history. The office is not required to develop the program unless a grant of private funds is made to the office to cover the program costs.
