IN RE: SB1100 by Deuell (relating to the promotion of tourism related to the musical heritage of this state.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>
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The bill requires the music office within the Governor's Office to develop a Texas Music History Tour program to promote and preserve Texas music history. The office is not required to develop the program unless a grant of private funds is made to the office to cover the program costs.
