IN RE: SB1602 by Estes (Relating to surveys accepted by the Commissioner of the Land Office for filing in the official records of the Land Office.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill stipulates that surveys already accepted by the General Land Office will not be subject to re-surveying. There would be minimal cost savings associated with this bill.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
