**IN RE: SB1657** by Staples (Relating to the modification of the conservatorship or possession of or access to a child by certain persons who fail to pay court-ordered child support.), **As Engrossed**

**No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would authorize the modification of a standard possession order if the conservator or other person entitled to possession of or access to the child has failed to pay child support for more than 12 consecutive months.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
