IN RE: SB1657 by Staples (Relating to the modification of the conservatorship or possession or access to a child by certain persons who fail to pay court-ordered child support.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would authorize the modification of a standard possession order if the conservator or other person entitled to possession of or access to the child has failed to pay child support for more than 12 consecutive months.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
