**IN RE: SB1744** by Shapleigh (Relating to the creation of the Texas-Mexico Strategic Investment Commission.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Government Code to establish the Texas-Mexico Strategic Investment Commission. Many of the commission's functions that are stipulated in the bill are currently statutorily required duties of the border commerce coordinator. It is anticipated that any costs to implement the provisions of the bill could be absorbed by existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
