## **AUTHOR'S / SPONSOR'S STATEMENT OF INTENT**

During the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, the legislature enacted H.B. 587, allowing funeral establishments to own and operate a crematory on their premises. The term "funeral establishment," is considered to be a broad and generic term, and consequently some people purchased or made arrangements to relocate existing crematory services to another property. However, those holding a commercial embalmer's license are not deemed to be funeral establishments, and thus are not allowed to hold a crematory establishment license under the statute.

H.B. 56 clarifies the statute and allows a person who holds a commercial embalmers establishment license to also hold a crematory establishment license.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to any state officer, institution, or agency.

## **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 651.656(b), Occupations Code, as follows:

- (b) Prohibits a person from holding a crematory establishment license unless the person holds a funeral establishment or commercial embalmers establishment license. Makes a conforming change.
- SECTION 2. Amends Section 651.352, Occupations Code, by adding Subsection (e), as follows:
  - (e) Authorizes a licensed commercial embalmers establishment that meets the licensing requirements under Subchapter N (Licensing Requirements: Crematories) to hold a crematory establishment license.

SECTION 3. Effective date: September 1, 2007.
