BILL ANALYSIS

C.S.H.B. 2734 By: Gattis Natural Resources Committee Report (Substituted)

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

Williamson-Liberty Hill Municipal Utility District will encompass approximately 228 acres of land in Williamson County, outside the extra-territorial jurisdiction of the City of Liberty Hill. The land to be located within the district will be developed into single family residential developments; and therefore, water, sewer, and drainage services need to be secured. It is necessary to create the municipal utility district under Chapters 49 (Provisions Applicable to All Districts) and 54 (Municipal Utility Districts), Water Code, in order to purchase, acquire, and/or construct facilities for such services to serve the future occupants of the land utilizing tax exempt bonds. C.S.H.B. 2734 provides regulations regarding the creation, administration, powers, duties, operation, and financing of the district.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, department, agency, or institution.

ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, by adding Chapter 8199, titled WILLIAMSON-LIBERTY HILL MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT containing the following provisions:

CHAPTER 8199. WILLIAMSON-LIBERTY HILL MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 8199.001. DEFINITIONS. Defines "board," "director," and "district."

Sec. 8199.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. Provides that the district is a municipal utility district created under and essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

Sec. 8199.003. CONFIRMATION ELECTION REQUIRED. (a) Provides that the board shall hold an election to confirm the creation of the district as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code. (b) Provides that if the creation of the district is not confirmed at a confirmation election before September 1, 2011: (1) the district is dissolved September 1, 2011, except that the district shall: (A) pay any debts incurred; (B) transfer to Williamson County any assets that remain after the payment of debts; and (C) maintain the organization of the district until all debts are paid and remaining assets are transferred; and (2) this chapter expires September 1, 2014.

Sec. 8199.004. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE. Provides that all land and other property in the district will benefit from the improvements and services to be provided by the district.

Sec. 8199.005. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. Sets forth the territory that will be initially included in the district by reference to Section 2 of the Act. Sets forth legislative findings relating to the boundaries of the district.

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SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Sec. 8199.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. Provides that the district is governed by a fivemember board of directors. Provides that directors serve staggered four-year terms.

Sec. 8199.052. INITIAL DIRECTORS. Sets forth the composition and terms of the initial board of directors. Provides that this section expires September 1, 2014.

SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

Sec. 8199.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. Provides that the district has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for which the district is created.

Sec. 8199.102. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND DUTIES. Provides that the district has the powers and duties provided by the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

Sec. 8199.103. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT RESOLUTION. Requires the district to comply with all applicable requirements of any resolution, adopted by the governing body of a municipality under Section 54.016, Water Code, that consents to the creation of the district or to the inclusion of land in the district.

Sec. 8199.104. WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY DESIGN APPROVAL. Requires the district to obtain approval of the Brazos River Authority for the design of any district wastewater treatment facility.

Sec. 8199.105. WASTEWATER SERVICE PROVIDERS. Provides that only the Brazos River Authority or a provider approved by the Brazos River Authority may provide wastewater service in the district.

Sec. 8199.106. COMPLIANCE WITH OCTOBER 2003 AGREEMENT. Requires the district to comply with the terms of the "Agreement Regarding Sewer Services Areas and Customers" among the Lower Colorado River Authority, the Brazos River Authority, the City of Georgetown, the City of Liberty Hill, and the Chisholm Trail Special Utility District dated October 31, 2003.

Sec. 8199.107. STREET REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE. Provides that after July 1, 2017, the district shall repair and maintain any streets in the district.

[Sections 8199.108-8199.150 reserved for expansion]

SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 8199.151. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. Authorizes the district, without an election, to issue bonds and other obligations secured by revenue or contract payments from a source other than ad valorem taxation. The election must be held in a manner provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to obtain voter approval before the district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds payable from ad valorem taxes.

Sec. 8199.152. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. Allows the district, if authorized at an election held under Sec. 8199.151, to impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable property in the district as provided by Chapter 49.107, Water Code. The board shall determine the tax rate and the rate may not exceed the rate approved at the election.

[Sections 8199.153-8199.200 reserved for expansion]

SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS

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Sec. 8199.201. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. Authorizes the district to issue bonds or other obligations payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees, revenue, grants, or other district money, or any combination of those sources to pay for any authorized district purpose.

Sec. 8199.202. TAXES FOR BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. At the time bonds or other obligations payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, are issued the board is required to impose a continuing direct annual ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, for each year that all or part of the bonds are outstanding. Also at this time, the district is required to annually impose an ad valorem tax on all taxable property in the district in an amount that shall be sufficient to pay the interest on the bonds or other obligations as the interest becomes due, create a sinking fund for the payment of principal of the bonds or other obligations when due or the redemption price at any earlier required redemption date, and pay the expenses of imposing the taxes.

SECTION 2. Sets forth a metes and bounds description of the territory that is to be initially included in the district, being approximately 228 acres of land.

SECTION 3. (a) Provides that the legal notice setting forth the substance of this Act has been published as provided by law. Provides that a notice and a copy of this Act have been furnished to the required persons, agencies, officials, or entities according to Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, Government Code.

(b) Provides that the governor has submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ).

(c) Provides that the TCEQ has filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives within the required time.

(d) Provides that all requirements of the constitution and laws of this state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled and accomplished.

SECTION 4. Provides that this Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

EFFECTIVE DATE

Upon passage, or, if the Act does not receive the necessary vote, the Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

COMPARISON OF ORIGINAL TO SUBSTITUTE

C.S.H.B. 2734 adds heading "SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS."

Organizes existing text under Sec. 8199.003 CONFIRMATION ELECTION REQUIRED as Subsection (a). Adds Sec. 8199.003 Subsection (b).

Substitutes names of members of initial board of directors for five new names.

Adds Sec. 8199.107. STREET REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE.
