(b) A person described by Subsection (a) commits an 15 administrative violation if the person offers to pay, pays, 16 solicits, or receives an improper inducement relating to the 17 18 delivery of benefits to an injured employee or improperly attempts to influence the delivery of benefits to an injured employee, 19 including through the making of improper threats. This section 20 21 applies to each person described by Subsection (a) who is a 22 participant in the workers' compensation system of this state and

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to an agent of such a person.

(c) A violation under this section is a Class A

1 <u>administrative violation.</u>

- SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
 only to the punishment for a violation occurring on or after the
 effective date of this Act. For purposes of this section, a
 violation is committed before the effective date of this Act if any
 element of the violation occurs before the effective date.
- 7 (b) A violation committed before the effective date of this 8 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the violation was 9 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 10 purpose.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
