## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

L	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the dismissal of a charge for failure to carry and
- 3 exhibit a driver's license.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 521.025, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subsections (f) and (g) to read as follows:
- 7 (f) A judge may dismiss a charge under this section if the
- 8 defendant provides to the court within 10 working days a driver's
- 9 <u>license:</u>
- 10 (1) issued to the defendant;
- 11 (2) appropriate for the type of vehicle operated; and
- 12 (3) valid at the time of the arrest for the offense.
- 13 (g) The judge may assess the defendant an administrative fee
- 14 not to exceed \$10 at the time the judge dismisses a charge under
- 15 Subsection (f).
- SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 18 Act. For the purposes of this section, an offense is committed
- 19 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 20 occurs before that date.
- (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 22 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 23 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
