- representing the state and law enforcement agencies, the attorney representing the state may transfer the property to law enforcement agencies to maintain, repair, use, and operate the property for official purposes if the property is free of any interest of an interest holder. The agency receiving the forfeited property may purchase the interest of an interest holder so that the property can be released for use by the agency. The agency receiving the forfeited property may maintain, repair, use, and operate the property with money appropriated for current operations. If the property is a motor vehicle subject to registration under the motor vehicle registration laws of this state, the agency receiving the

SECTION 2. Sections 683.016(a) and (b), Transportation

Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 1 (a) The law enforcement agency that takes an abandoned motor 2 vehicle into custody that is not claimed under Section 683.012 may:
- 3 (1) use the vehicle for agency purposes; or

- (2) transfer the vehicle to any municipal or county agency for the use of that agency.
 - (b) The law enforcement agency shall auction the vehicle as provided by this subchapter if the <u>law enforcement</u> agency <u>or the municipal or county agency to which the vehicle was transferred under Subsection (a) discontinues use of the vehicle.</u>
 - SECTION 3. Article 59.06(b), Code of Criminal Procedure, and Section 683.016, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act, apply to personal property seized or taken into custody on or after the effective date of this Act. Personal property seized or taken into custody before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the property is seized or taken into custody, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
