1 advanced high school program established under Section 28.025; and 2 (2) have attended [high school exclusively in] one or more public high schools in this state for the majority of time the 3 4 person attended high school[; and [(3) be a Texas resident as defined by coordinating 5 6 board rule]. (e) The coordinating board shall adopt rules 7 for determining whether a person attended public high school in this 8 state as required by Subsection (a)(2). 9 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 10 a student who graduates from a public high school in this state on 11 or after the effective date of this Act. A student who graduates 12 from a public high school in this state before the effective date of 13 14 this Act and the student's eligibility to participate in the Early 15 High School Graduation Scholarship program is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the 16 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 17

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
