## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- Sec. 15. CASE FILES. (a) The county clerk shall maintain a case file for each decedent's estate in which a probate proceeding has been filed. The case file must contain all orders, judgments, and proceedings of the court and any other probate filing with the

6	(b) The county clerk may not post on the Internet the
7	following information contained in a decedent's case file:
8	(1) the residential address and phone number of the

12	(3) a phone number of the decedent's personal
13	representative or a distributee of the decedent's estate;

16	(c) In this section, "identifying financial information"
17	means information that alone or in conjunction with other
18	information can be used to access an account at a financial
19	institution or to access other information regarding an
