A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a study and report concerning predicted faculty
- 3 retirement at general academic teaching institutions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 51.4021 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.4021. STUDY AND REPORT OF PREDICTED FACULTY
- 8 RETIREMENT. (a) In this section, "general academic teaching
- 9 institution," "governing board," and "university system" have the
- 10 meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
- 11 (b) To address the predicted retirement of a growing portion
- 12 of university faculty in the coming years and the potential
- 13 problems associated with that retirement, each general academic
- 14 teaching institution shall conduct a study relating to faculty
- 15 member retirements that may occur through the end of the 2025
- 16 academic year, including projections of the number and proportion
- of faculty members expected to retire during that period, the first
- 18 <u>academic year in which increasing retirements are expected to</u>
- 19 result in faculty shortages, and methods that the institution could
- 20 reasonably implement to address those retirement issues through
- 21 recruitment of new faculty members or other means. The governing
- 22 board of an institution may appoint a committee to conduct the
- 23 study. A university system may carry out the requirements
- 24 prescribed by this subsection for the system's component

- 1 institutions or may direct one or more component institutions to
- 2 conduct the study for the system.
- 3 <u>(c) Each general academic teaching institution or</u>
- 4 university system, as applicable, shall prepare a report based on
- 5 the study required by Subsection (b). The institution or system
- 6 shall submit the report to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 7 Board not later than September 1, 2008.
- 8 <u>(d) This section expires January 1, 2009.</u>
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
