A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the absence of a student from school for activities in 3 connection with obtaining United States citizenship. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 25.087, Education Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: 7 (b) A school district shall excuse a student from attending 8 school for: 9 (1) the purpose of observing religious holy days, 10 11 including traveling for that purpose; (2) a [. A school district shall excuse a student 12 13 for] temporary absence resulting from an appointment with a health 14 care professional [professionals] if the [that] student commences classes or returns to school on the same day of the appointment; or 15 (3) the purpose of appearing at a governmental office 16 to complete paperwork required in connection with the student's 17 18 application for United States citizenship or to take part in a naturalization oath ceremony, including traveling for that 19 20 <u>purpose</u>. 21 (c) A student whose absence is excused under Subsection (b) 22 [this subsection] may not be penalized for that absence and shall be counted as if the student attended school for purposes of 23

district. A student whose absence is excused under <u>Subsection (b)</u>
[this subsection] shall be allowed a reasonable time to make up
school work missed on those days. If the student satisfactorily
completes the school work, the day of absence shall be counted as a
day of compulsory attendance.

6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
