1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to the fee charged for depositing a will during a  
1-9 testator's life.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Section 71(a), Texas Probate Code, is amended to  
1-12 read as follows:

1-13 (a) Deposit of Will. A will may be deposited by the person  
1-14 making it, or by another person for him, with the county clerk of  
1-15 the county of the testator's residence. Before accepting any will  
1-16 for deposit, the clerk may require such proof as shall be  
1-17 satisfactory to him concerning the testator's identity and  
1-18 residence. The clerk, on being paid a fee of Five [~~Three~~] Dollars  
1-19 therefor, shall receive and keep the will, and shall give a  
1-20 certificate of deposit for it. All wills so filed shall be numbered  
1-21 by the clerk in consecutive order, and all certificates of deposit  
1-22 shall bear like numbers respectively.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
