A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to health benefit plan coverage for reconstructive surgery
- 3 following mastectomy.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1357.002, Insurance Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1357.002. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. (a) This
- 8 subchapter applies only to a health benefit plan that provides
- 9 benefits for medical or surgical expenses incurred as a result of a
- 10 health condition, accident, or sickness, including an individual,
- 11 group, blanket, or franchise insurance policy or insurance
- 12 agreement, a group hospital service contract, or an individual or
- 13 group evidence of coverage or similar coverage document that is
- 14 offered by:

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- 15 (1) an insurance company;
- 16 (2) a group hospital service corporation operating
- 17 under Chapter 842;
- 18 (3) a fraternal benefit society operating under
- 19 Chapter 885;
- 20 (4) a stipulated premium company operating under
- 21 Chapter 884;
- 22 (5) a reciprocal exchange operating under Chapter 942;
- 23 (6) a health maintenance organization operating under
- 24 Chapter 843;

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- 1 (7) a multiple employer welfare arrangement that holds
- 2 a certificate of authority under Chapter 846; or
- 3 (8) an approved nonprofit health corporation that
- 4 holds a certificate of authority under Chapter 844.
- 5 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a standard health
- 6 benefit plan provided under Chapter 1507 must provide the coverage
- 7 required by this subchapter.
- 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to a health benefit plan that is delivered, issued for delivery, or
- 10 renewed on or after January 1, 2008. A health benefit plan that is
- 11 delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2008,
- is covered by the law in effect at the time the health benefit plan
- 13 was delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed, and that law is
- 14 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
