Subchapter A, Chapter 436, Health and Safety 5 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 436.004 to read as follows: Sec. 436.004. WARNING SIGN REGARDING MERCURY LEVELS IN 7 CERTAIN FISH. (a) A retail fish dealer shall post a warning sign in 8 a conspicuous location where it is readily visible by persons 9 purchasing fresh or previously frozen fish. The executive 10 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission by rule 11 12 shall specify the size and graphic design of the sign. The sign must be printed in the two languages that are most commonly spoken 13 in the area in which the dealer is located and contain wording in 14 those languages equivalent to the following: 15 ATTENTION WOMEN CONSIDERING BECOMING PREGNANT, PREGNANT 16 WOMEN, NURSING MOTHERS, AND PARENTS OF YOUNG CHILDREN 17 18 Some fish and shellfish, especially large fish such as shark, swordfish, king mackerel, and tilefish, contain high levels of 19 mercury that may harm the developing nervous system of a child. 20 21 For more information about the risks of mercury in fish and shellfish call the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's food 22 information line toll-free at (insert toll-free telephone number). 23 (b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human 24
