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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of a pilot program by the Health and 3 Human Services Commission to accept importation of electronic eligibility information from a regional indigent care provider. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 531.02413 to read as follows: 7 8 Sec. 531.02413. ELECTRONIC ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION PILOT PROJECT. (a) The commission shall establish a pilot project in at 9 least one urban area of this state to determine the feasibility, 10 costs, and benefits of accepting, for the purpose of establishing 11 12 eligibility for benefits under state and federal health and human services programs administered by the commission, the direct 13 importation of electronic eligibility information from an 14 electronic system operated by a regional indigent care 15 16 collaborative system. (b) An area selected for the pilot project under this 17 18 section must possess a functioning indigent care collaborative system that includes a network of providers and assesses 19 eligibility for health and human services programs using electronic 20 21 systems. The electronic systems used by the collaborative system 22 must be able to interface with electronic systems managed by the 23 commission to enable the commission to import application and eligibility information regarding applicants for health and human 24

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1 services programs. 2 (c) In establishing a pilot project under this section, the 3 commission shall: 4 (1) focus on creating a project in which electronic 5 applications for indigent care created by a regional indigent care 6 network may be shared with the commission to facilitate enrollment in heal<u>th and human services programs administered by the</u> 7 8 commission; 9 (2) solicit and obtain support for the project from local officials and indigent care providers; 10 (3) ensure that all identifying and descriptive 11 12 information of recipients in each health and human services program included in the project can only be accessed by providers or other 13 14 entities participating in the project; and 15 (4) ensure that the storage and communication of all identifying and descriptive information included in the project 16 17 complies with existing federal and state privacy laws governing individually identifiable information for recipients of public 18 19 benefits programs. SECTION 2. Not later than the 180th day after the effective 20 date of this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall 21 take action to begin implementation of the pilot project 22 established under Section 531.02413, Government Code, as added by 23 24 this Act. 25 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2008, the Health and 26 Human Services Commission shall: 27 (1) assess the cost-effectiveness, efficacy,

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efficiency, and benefits of using electronic eligibility information imported from electronic systems operated by regional indigent care collaborative systems; and

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4 (2) report the commission's findings resulting from 5 the pilot project established under Section 531.02413, Government 6 Code, as added by this Act, to the standing committees of the senate 7 and the house of representatives having primary jurisdiction over 8 health and human services issues.

9 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 14 waiver or authorization is granted.

15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
