- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 408.002, Property Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 408.002. FEES. The commission shall adopt fees as
- 8 required by this title in amounts that are reasonable and necessary
- 9 to provide sufficient revenue to cover the costs of administering
- 10 this title. The commission may not charge a homeowner a fee in
- 11 connection with a complaint, request, or other proceeding under
- 12 Chapter 409 or Subtitle D.
- SECTION 2. Section 428.001(b), Property Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (b) The request must:
- 16 (1) specify in reasonable detail each alleged
- 17 construction defect that is a subject of the request;
- 18 (2) state the amount of any known out-of-pocket
- 19 expenses and engineering or consulting fees incurred by the
- 20 homeowner in connection with each alleged construction defect;
- 21 (3) include any evidence that depicts the nature and
- 22 cause of each alleged construction defect and the nature and extent
- of repairs necessary to remedy the construction defect, including,
- 24 if available, expert reports, photographs, and videotapes, if that

- 1 evidence would be discoverable under Rule 192, Texas Rules of Civil
- 2 Procedure; and
- 3 (4) [be accompanied by the fees required under Section
- 4 426.004; and
- 5 $\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ state the name of any person who has, on behalf
- of the requestor, inspected the home in connection with an alleged
- 7 construction defect.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 428.004(d), Property Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (d) The [Except as provided by this subsection, the]
- 11 third-party inspector's recommendation may not include payment of
- 12 any monetary consideration. [If the inspector finds for the party
- 13 who submitted the request, the commission may order the other party
- 14 to reimburse all or part of the fees and inspection expenses paid by
- 15 the requestor under Section 426.004.
- SECTION 4. Section 426.004, Property Code, is repealed.
- 17 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 18 to a complaint, request, or other proceeding initiated on or after
- 19 the effective date of this Act. A complaint, request, or other
- 20 proceeding initiated before the effective date of this Act is
- 21 governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that
- law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
