(c) A court that delays further action under Subsection (a) 1 2 of this section may issue any order it considers necessary to protect the proposed ward or the proposed ward's estate. 3 4 (d) The court shall resume the guardianship proceeding if the court determines that venue is more suitable in that court. If 5 6 the court determines that venue is more suitable in the foreign court, the court shall, with the consent of the foreign court, 7 8 transfer the proceeding to the foreign court.

9 SECTION 2. Section 894, Texas Probate Code, as added by this 10 Act, applies only to a guardianship proceeding filed on or after the 11 effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
