A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a study regarding the conversion of certain Class C

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) The Office of Court Administration of the
- 6 Texas Judicial System shall conduct a study to determine the
- 7 feasibility, efficiency, and potential cost savings of converting
- 8 certain Class C misdemeanors to civil infractions. In conducting
- 9 the study, the office shall examine:
- 10 (1) which Class C misdemeanors are appropriate to
- 11 convert to civil infractions; and
- 12 (2) which civil collections procedures involving
- judicial oversight could be used to collect fines, court costs, and
- 14 fees on the civil infractions.
- 15 (b) For input regarding the study, the Office of Court
- 16 Administration of the Texas Judicial System:
- 17 (1) shall consult with county and municipal court
- 18 judges, justices of the peace, the Department of Public Safety, the
- 19 Parks and Wildlife Department, and the Texas District and County
- 20 Attorneys Association; and
- 21 (2) may consult with any other appropriate agency or
- 22 organization.
- (c) Not later than October 1, 2008, the Office of Court
- 24 Administration of the Texas Judicial System shall file a report

- 1 containing the results of the study and recommendations for
- 2 legislation with the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker
- 3 of the house of representatives, and the chairs of the standing
- 4 committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 5 jurisdiction over the judicial system.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
