## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the development of a standard method of computing a
- 3 student's high school grade point average.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 28.0252(a) and (b), Education Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commissioner  $\underline{shall}$  [ $\underline{may}$ ] develop a standard method
- 8 of computing a student's high school grade point average that
- 9 provides for additional weight to be given to each honors course,
- 10 advanced placement course, international baccalaureate course, or
- 11 dual credit course completed by a student.
- 12 (b) A [If the commissioner develops a standard method under
- 13 this section, a] school district shall use the standard method
- 14 developed by the commissioner under Subsection (a) to compute a
- 15 student's high school grade point average, and the student's grade
- 16 point average computed in that manner shall be used in determining
- 17 the student's eligibility for automatic college admission under
- 18 Section 51.803.
- 19 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- of this Act, the commissioner of education shall develop a standard
- 21 method of computing a student's high school grade point average as
- required by Section 28.0252(a), Education Code, as amended by this
- 23 Act.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
