- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 508.183, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 508.183. EDUCATIONAL SKILL LEVEL. (a) A parole panel
- 9 shall require as a condition of release on parole or release to
- 10 mandatory supervision that an inmate demonstrate to the parole
- 11 panel whether the inmate:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> has an educational skill level that is equal to or
- 13 greater than the average skill level of students who have completed
- 14 the sixth grade in a public school in this state, if the inmate is
- 15 younger than 18 years of age; or
- 16 (2) has received a high school equivalency
- 17 certificate, if the inmate is 18 years of age or older.
- 18 (b) If the parole panel determines that the inmate has not
- 19 attained the [that] skill level required by Subsection (a)(1) or
- 20 received a high school equivalency certificate, as required by
- 21 Subsection (a)(2), the parole panel shall require as a condition of
- 22 parole or mandatory supervision that the inmate as a releasee
- 23 attain that level of educational skill or receive a high school
- 24 equivalency certificate, as applicable at the time of release,

- 1 unless the parole panel determines that the inmate lacks the
- 2 intellectual capacity or the learning ability to ever achieve that
- 3 level of skill or receive that certificate.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to a person who is released on parole or to mandatory supervision on
- 6 or after the effective date of this Act. A person released on
- 7 parole or to mandatory supervision before the effective date of
- 8 this Act is covered by the law in effect on the date the person was
- 9 released, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 10 purpose.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
