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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a competitive grant program to fund nurse-family 3 partnership programs in certain communities in this state. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by 5 6 adding Subchapter M to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER M. NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM 7 Sec. 531.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 8 9 (1) "Competitive grant program" means the nurse-family partnership competitive grant program established 10 11 under this subchapter. 12 (2) "Partnership program" means a nurse-family 13 partnership program. Sec. 531.452. ESTABLISHMENT OF NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP 14 COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish a 15 nurse-family partnership competitive grant program through which 16 the commission will award grants for the implementation of 17 nurse-family partnership programs, or the expansion of existing 18 programs, and for the operation of those programs for a period of 19 not less than two years. 20 21 (b) The commission shall award grants under the program to applicants, including the YWCA of Metropolitan Dallas, in a manner 22 23 that ensures that the partnership programs collectively: 24 (1) operate in multiple communities; and

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1	(2) provide program services to approximately 1,200
2	families.
3	Sec. 531.453. PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. A
4	partnership program funded through a grant awarded under this
5	subchapter must:
6	(1) strictly adhere to the program model developed by
7	the Nurse-Family Partnership National Service Office, including
8	any clinical, programmatic, and data collection requirements of
9	that model;
10	(2) require that registered nurses regularly visit the
11	homes of low-income, first-time mothers participating in the
12	program to provide services designed to:
13	(A) improve pregnancy outcomes;
14	(B) improve child health and development;
15	(C) improve family economic self-sufficiency and
16	stability; and
17	(D) reduce the incidence of child abuse and
18	neglect; and
19	(3) require that the regular nurse visits described by
20	Subdivision (2) begin not later than a mother's 28th week of
21	gestation and end when her child reaches two years of age.
22	Sec. 531.454. APPLICATION. (a) A public or private entity,
23	including a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of
24	this state, may apply for a grant under this subchapter.
25	(b) To apply for a grant, an applicant must submit a written
26	application to the commission on a form prescribed by the
27	commission in consultation with the Nurse-Family Partnership

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## 1 National Service Office. 2 (c) The application prescribed by the commission must: 3 (1) require the applicant to provide data on the number 4 of low-income, first-time mothers residing in the community in 5 which the applicant proposes to operate or expand a partnership program and provide a description of existing services available to 6 7 those mothers; 8 (2) describe the ongoing monitoring and evaluation 9 process to which a grant recipient is subject under Section 531.459, including the recipient's obligation to collect and 10 provide information requested by the commission under Section 11 12 531.459(c); and (3) require the applicant to provide other relevant 13 14 information as determined by the commission. 15 Sec. 531.455. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN AWARDING GRANTS. In addition to the factors described by Sections 16 17 531.452(b) and 531.453, in determining whether to award a grant to an applicant under this subchapter, the commission shall consider: 18 19 (1) the demonstrated need for a partnership program in the community in which the applicant proposes to operate or expand 20 21 the program, which may be determined by considering: 22 (A) the poverty rate, the crime rate, the number of births to Medicaid recipients, the rate of poor birth outcomes, 23 24 and the incidence of child abuse and neglect during a prescribed 25 period in the community; and 26 (B) the need to enhance school readiness in the 27 community;

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1	(2) the applicant's ability to participate in ongoing
2	monitoring and performance evaluations under Section 531.459,
3	including the applicant's ability to collect and provide
4	information requested by the commission under Section 531.459(c);
5	(3) the applicant's ability to adhere to the
6	partnership program standards adopted under Section 531.456;
7	(4) the applicant's ability to develop broad-based
8	community support for implementing or expanding a partnership
9	program, as applicable; and
10	(5) the applicant's history of developing and
11	sustaining innovative, high-quality programs that meet the needs of
12	families and communities.
13	Sec. 531.456. PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM STANDARDS. The executive
14	commissioner, with the assistance of the Nurse-Family Partnership
15	National Service Office, shall adopt standards for the partnership
16	programs funded under this subchapter. The standards must adhere
17	to the Nurse-Family Partnership National Service Office program
18	model standards and guidelines that were developed in multiple,
19	randomized clinical trials and have been tested and replicated in
20	multiple communities.
21	Sec. 531.457. USE OF AWARDED GRANT FUNDS. The grant funds
22	awarded under this subchapter may be used only to cover costs
23	related to implementing or expanding and operating a partnership
24	program, including costs related to:
25	(1) administering the program;
26	(2) training and managing registered nurses who
27	participate in the program;

1	(3) paying the salaries and expenses of registered
2	nurses who participate in the program;
3	(4) paying for facilities and equipment for the
4	program; and
5	(5) paying for services provided by the Nurse-Family
6	Partnership National Service Office to ensure a grant recipient
7	adheres to the organization's program model.
8	Sec. 531.458. STATE NURSE CONSULTANT. Using money
9	appropriated for the competitive grant program, the commission
10	shall contract with a state nurse consultant to assist grant
11	recipients with implementing or expanding and operating the
12	partnership programs in the applicable communities.
13	Sec. 531.459. PROGRAM MONITORING AND EVALUATION; ANNUAL
14	COMMITTEE REPORTS. (a) The commission, with the assistance of the
15	Nurse-Family Partnership National Service Office, shall:
16	(1) adopt performance indicators that are designed to
17	measure a grant recipient's performance with respect to the
18	partnership program standards adopted by the commission under
19	Section 531.456;
20	(2) use the performance indicators to continuously
21	monitor and formally evaluate on an annual basis the performance of
22	each grant recipient; and
23	(3) prepare and submit an annual report, not later
24	than December 1 of each year, to the Senate Health and Human
25	Services Committee, or its successor, and the House Human Services
26	Committee, or its successor, regarding the performance of each
27	grant recipient during the preceding state fiscal year with respect

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1 to providing partnership program services. 2 The report required under Subsection (a)(3) must (b) 3 include: 4 (1) the number of low-income, first-time mothers to 5 whom each grant recipient provided partnership program services; 6 (2) the extent to which each grant recipient made 7 regular visits to mothers during the period described by Section 8 531.453(3); and 9 (3) the extent to which each grant recipient adhered to the Nurse-Family Partnership National Service Office's program 10 model, <u>including the extent to which registered nurses</u>: 11 12 (A) conducted home visitations comparable in frequency, duration, and content to those delivered in Nurse-Family 13 14 Partnership National Service Office clinical trials; and 15 (B) assessed the health and well-being of mothers 16 and children participating in the partnership programs in 17 accordance with indicators of maternal, child, and family health defined by the commission in consultation with the Nurse-Family 18 19 Partnership National Service Office. (c) On request, each grant recipient shall timely collect 20 21 and provide data and any other information required by the 22 commission to monitor and evaluate the recipient or to prepare the report required by this section. 23 24 Sec. 531.460. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING. (a) The 25 commission shall actively seek and apply for any available federal funds, including federal Medicaid and Temporary Aid for Needy 26

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Family (TANF) funds, to assist in financing the competitive grant

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1 program established under this subchapter.

2 (b) The commission may use appropriated funds from the state 3 government and may accept gifts, donations, and grants of money 4 from the federal government, local governments, private 5 corporations, or other persons to assist in financing the 6 competitive grant program.

7 SECTION 2. (a) As required by Section 531.460(a), 8 Government Code, as added by this Act, the Health and Human Services 9 Commission shall, as soon as practicable, apply for any available 10 federal funds to assist in financing the nurse-family partnership 11 competitive grant program under Subchapter M, Chapter 531, 12 Government Code, as added by this Act.

(b) Not later than December 1, 2007, the Health and Human
Services Commission shall establish and implement the nurse-family
partnership competitive grant program required by Subchapter M,
Chapter 531, Government Code, as added by this Act.

(c) Not later than December 1, 2008, the Health and Human
Services Commission shall submit the initial annual report required
by Section 531.459(a)(3), Government Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
