No. 427 expenses for the food, lodging, and compensation 1 (4) 2 of jurors; 3 (5) compensation of witnesses; 4 the cost of preparation of a statement of facts and (6) 5 a transcript of the trial for purposes of appeal; 6 (7) if the death of a person is an element of the 7 offense, expenses of an inquest relating to the death; 8 (8) food, lodging, and travel expenses incurred by the prosecutor's staff during travel essential to the prosecution of 9 the offense; 10 (9) court reporter's fees; and 11 (10) the cost of special security officers. 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 61, Human Resources Code, 13 is amended by adding Section 61.098 to read as follows: 14 15 Sec. 61.098. PROSECUTION OF CERTAIN CRIMES OCCURRING AT 16 COMMISSION FACILITY. In a county in which property owned or 17 operated by or under contract with the commission is located, the district attorney, criminal district attorney, or county attorney 18 19 performing the duties of a district attorney, as appropriate, may request that the special prosecution unit prosecute an offense 20 21 described under Article 104.003(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, that is committed on that property. 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 23 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
