## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study of methods to increase public school student
3	participation in the national school breakfast program and school
4	district participation in a special assistance provision of the
5	national free or reduced-price breakfast or lunch program.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 33, Education Code, is amended by adding Sections 33.9011 and 33.9012 to read as follows:
- 9 <u>Sec. 33.9011. STUDY REGARDING PARTICIPATION IN BREAKFAST</u>
  10 <u>PROGRAM.</u> (a) In this section, "breakfast program" means the
  11 <u>national school breakfast program provided for by the Child</u>
  12 <u>Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. Section 1773).</u>
- 13 (b) The agency shall conduct a study to identify methods for

  14 increasing the number of students who participate in the breakfast

  15 program, including:
- (1) conducting a cost-benefit analysis in school
  districts in which 60 percent or more of the students qualify for
  free or reduced-priced breakfast to determine the impact of
  providing a free breakfast to:
- 20 <u>(A) students who would otherwise pay a reduced</u>
  21 <u>price for breakfast; and</u>
- (B) all students in the district regardless of family income; and
- 24 (2) identifying programs and practices in school

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- districts in this state and other states that are effective in
- 2 increasing participation in the breakfast program.
- 3 (c) The cost-benefit analysis required under Subsection (b)
- 4 must:
- 5 (1) include an analysis of school districts that
- 6 provide free breakfast to all students in the district regardless
- 7 <u>of family income; and</u>
- 8 (2) assess:
- 9 (A) administrative costs to a school district;
- 10 (B) federal reimbursement made to a school
- district for free or reduced-price breakfast;
- 12 (C) cost per breakfast to a school district; and
- (D) participation of students in the breakfast
- 14 program.
- 15 (d) Not later than October 31, 2008, the commissioner shall
- 16 prepare and deliver a report describing the results of the study to
- 17 the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of
- 18 representatives. The report must:
- 19 (1) include the cost-benefit analysis required under
- 20 Subsection (b);
- 21 (2) outline effective programs and practices
- 22 <u>identified under Subsection (b); and</u>
- 23 (3) recommend to the legislature methods for
- increasing participation in the breakfast program.
- (e) This subsection expires January 1, 2009.
- Sec. 33.9012. BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PROGRAMS RESTRICTIONS.
- 27 (a) <u>In this section:</u>

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- 1 (1) "Breakfast and lunch program" means the national
- 2 free or reduced-price breakfast and lunch program established under
- 3 42 U.S.C. Section 1751 et seq.
- 4 (2) "Special assistance provision of the breakfast or
- 5 lunch program" means the special assistance certification and
- 6 reimbursement alternative of the breakfast or lunch program that
- 7 <u>allows a school district or a campus in a school district to offer</u>
- 8 <u>free breakfast or lunch to all students enrolled in that district or</u>
- 9 campus.
- 10 (b) The agency may not impose a standard or requirement on a
- 11 school district's application to act under the special assistance
- 12 provision of the breakfast or lunch program that is more
- 13 restrictive than a federal standard or requirement applicable to
- 14 the provision.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
