A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the confidentiality of certain personal information
- 3 that pertains to certain officers and employees of a community
- 4 supervision and corrections department.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 552.117(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Information is excepted from the requirements of
- 9 Section 552.021 if it is information that relates to the home
- 10 address, home telephone number, or social security number of the
- 11 following person or that reveals whether the person has family
- 12 members:
- 13 (1) a current or former official or employee of a
- 14 governmental body, except as otherwise provided by Section
- 15 552.024;
- 16 (2) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code
- 17 of Criminal Procedure, or a security officer commissioned under
- 18 Section 51.212, Education Code, regardless of whether the officer
- 19 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;
- 20 (3) a current or former employee of the Texas
- 21 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
- 22 the department or any division of the department, regardless of
- 23 whether the current or former employee complies with Section
- 24 552.1175;

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- 1 (4) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code
- 2 of Criminal Procedure, or other law, a reserve law enforcement
- 3 officer, a commissioned deputy game warden, or a corrections
- 4 officer in a municipal, county, or state penal institution in this
- 5 state who was killed in the line of duty, regardless of whether the
- 6 deceased complied with Section 552.024 or 552.1175; [or]
- 7 (5) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 8 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, regardless of whether the
- 9 officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable:
- 10 <u>or</u>
- 11 (6) an officer or employee of a community supervision
- 12 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who
- 13 performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b), regardless of
- 14 whether the officer or employee complies with Section 552.024 or
- 15 <u>552.1175</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 557.1175(a), Government Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) This section applies only to:
- 19 (1) peace officers as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 20 Criminal Procedure;
- 21 (2) county jailers as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 22 Occupations Code;
- 23 (3) current or former employees of the Texas
- 24 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
- 25 the department or any division of the department;
- 26 (4) commissioned security officers as defined by
- 27 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code; [and]

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- 1 (5) employees of a district attorney, criminal
- 2 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 3 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 4 matters; and
- 5 (6) officers and employees of a community supervision
- 6 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who perform
- 7 <u>a duty described by Section 76.004(b)</u>.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
- 9 as follows:
- 10 (a) This section applies only to:
- 11 (1) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code
- 12 of Criminal Procedure;
- 13 (2) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 14 Occupations Code;
- 15 (3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
- 16 Justice;
- 17 (4) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 18 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code; [and]
- 19 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
- 20 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
- 21 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
- 22 misdemeanor; and
- 23 (6) an officer or employee of a community supervision
- 24 and corrections department established under Chapter 76,
- 25 Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b)
- of that code.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
