- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 32.51(a)(1), Penal Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Identifying information" means information that
- 8 alone or in conjunction with other information identifies an
- 9 individual, including an individual's:
- 10 (A) name and $[\tau]$ social security number, date of
- 11 birth, or [and] government-issued identification number;
- 12 (B) unique biometric data, including the
- 13 individual's fingerprint, voice print, or [and] retina or iris
- 14 image;
- 15 (C) unique electronic identification number,
- 16 address, [and] routing code, or financial institution account
- 17 number; and
- 18 (D) telecommunication identifying information or
- 19 access device.
- SECTION 2. Sections 32.51(b) and (c), Penal Code, are
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (b) A person commits an offense if the person, with the
- 23 intent to harm or defraud another, obtains, possesses, transfers,
- 24 or uses identifying information of:

- 1 (1) a deceased natural person, including a stillborn
- 2 <u>infant or fetus, without legal authorization; or</u>
- 3 $\underline{(2)}$ another person without the other person's consent
- 4 [and with intent to harm or defraud another].
- 5 (c) An offense under Subsection (b)(1) is a felony of the
- 6 third degree, and an offense under Subsection (b)(2) [this section]
- 7 is a state jail felony.
- 8 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 11 covered by the law in effect at the time the offense was committed,
- 12 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 13 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 14 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 15 committed before that date.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
