## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to an energy efficiency products pilot program. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Chapter 31, Utilities Code, is amended by adding 4 5 Section 31.006 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 31.006. ENERGY EFFICIENCY PRODUCTS PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall develop and implement a pilot program that 7 requires an electric utility to establish a program that enables 8 9 building owners and tenants to obtain and install energy efficiency products and to pay for the products through the use of a monthly 10 energy services charge. 11 12 (b) In developing the program, the commission must ensure that: 13 14 (1) the monthly energy services charge for a product that is not portable is assigned to the meter location and not to 15 16 the individual customer; (2) sufficient notice of the monthly energy services 17 charge is provided to subsequent owners and tenants; 18 (3) service may be <u>disconnected</u> for nonpayment of the 19 monthly energy services charge; 20 21 (4) the monthly energy services charge is lower than 22 the estimated savings that will accrue from using the product; and 23 (5) there is an independent certification that 24 products are appropriate and that the savings exceed the costs.

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1	(c) The commission shall require at least one electric
2	utility inside ERCOT and one electric utility outside ERCOT to
3	establish the program.
4	(d) Not later than December 15, 2008, the commission shall
5	submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the
6	electric utility restructuring legislative oversight committee
7	that:
8	(1) describes the operation of the pilot program;
9	(2) analyzes the effect of the pilot program in
10	reducing energy consumption and energy costs; and
11	(3) makes recommendations regarding any necessary
12	changes to the pilot program.
13	(e) Not later than December 15, 2010, the commission shall
14	submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the
15	electric utility restructuring legislative oversight committee
16	that:
17	(1) describes the continuing operation of the pilot
18	program;
19	(2) analyzes the continuing effect of the pilot
20	program in reducing energy consumption and energy costs; and
21	(3) makes recommendations regarding the continuation
22	or expansion of the pilot program.
23	(f) This section expires September 1, 2011.
24	SECTION 2. The Public Utility Commission of Texas shall
25	implement the pilot program required by Section 31.006, Utilities
26	Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2008.
27	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
