- 13 (b) The commission may establish procedures for the
- 14 revocation of a license issued under this chapter[, other than a
- 15 license issued to an officer elected under the Texas Constitution].
- 16 (d) The commission may revoke a license issued under this
- 17 chapter to an officer elected under the Texas Constitution only if
- 18 the officer is convicted of:
- (1) a felony; or
- 20 (2) a criminal offense directly involving the person's
- 21 duties as an officer.
- 22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 23 to an officer elected under the Texas Constitution who is convicted
- 24 of a felony or criminal offense that is committed on or after the

- 1 effective date of this Act. A conviction for an offense committed
- 2 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 3 effect when the offense was committed, and that law is continued in
- 4 effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense
- 5 is committed on or after the effective date of this Act if any
- 6 element of the offense is committed on or after that date.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
