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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to a prescription drug retail price registry and 3 disclosure of a list of prescription drug retail prices. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 531.093 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 531.093. PRESCRIPTION DRUG RETAIL PRICE REGISTRY. (a) In this section, "retail price": 8 9 (1) means the actual price to be paid to a pharmacy by a retail purchaser for a drug listed under Section 562.252, 10 Occupations Code, at the listed dosage, including the charge for 11 12 the cost of the medication and the dispensing fee; and (2) may not be more than the pharmacy's usual and 13 14 customary or posted or advertised charge. (b) The commission shall establish a drug retail price 15 registry to make retail price information for the 150 most 16 frequently prescribed prescription drugs in the state readily 17 available to consumers. 18 (c) The registry created by the commission under Subsection 19 (b) must: 20 21 (1) contain at each pharmacy in the state other than a Class E pharmacy, as described by Section 560.051(f), Occupations 22 23 Code, the retail price of each drug described by Subsection (b); 24 (2) be updated at least weekly, or as directed by the

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1	commissioner, to reflect the most current price
2	information available to the commission;
3	(3) be organized in a format that is conducive to
4	review by consumers and comparison of retail prices within each zip
5	code in the state; and
6	(4) include the name and address of each pharmacy.
7	(d) The commission shall make the information contained in
8	the registry available in English and Spanish on its website.
9	(e) The website must:
10	(1) contain the information required by Subsection
11	<u>(c);</u>
12	(2) be designed so that the consumer may download and
13	print the displayed information;
14	(3) include links to other governmental information
15	resources that provide information relating to the regulation of
16	prescription drugs and state and federal health care coverage and
17	pharmaceutical assistance programs;
18	(4) include an advisory statement alerting a consumer
19	of the need to tell the consumer's health care practitioner and
20	pharmacist about all the medications the consumer may be taking and
21	to ask the practitioner or pharmacist how to avoid harmful
22	interactions between those drugs, if any; and
23	(5) contain clearly understandable language that
24	assists consumers in understanding the content of and how to access
25	the information made available on the website.
26	(f) The commission may require a pharmacy to provide
27	information the commission considers necessary to administer this

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1	section.
2	(g) The commission may contract with a public or private
3	entity to develop, administer, or maintain the registry established
4	under this section. A contract entered into under this subsection
5	must specify the duties and responsibilities of the entity with
6	respect to the development, administration, and maintenance of the
7	registry. The commission shall monitor the work of any entity with
8	which the commission contracts under this subsection to ensure that
9	the registry is developed, administered, and maintained under the
10	requirements of this section.
11	(h) The commission shall adopt rules necessary to
12	administer this section.
13	SECTION 2. Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is amended by
14	adding Subchapter F to read as follows:
15	SUBCHAPTER F. DRUG RETAIL PRICE DISCLOSURE
16	Sec. 562.251. DEFINITION. In this section, "retail price"
17	has the meaning assigned by Section 531.093, Government Code.
18	Sec. 562.252. COMMISSION DUTY TO COMPILE LIST. The Health
19	and Human Services Commission shall compile annually a list of the
20	150 most frequently dispensed prescription drugs in the state,
21	including the usual dosages of those drugs. The commission shall
22	provide the list free of charge to license holders for use by the
23	license holders to produce the drug retail price list required by
24	this subchapter.
25	Sec. 562.253. PRESCRIPTION DRUG RETAIL PRICE LIST. (a) A
26	pharmacy shall compile a prescription drug retail price list
27	containing:

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1	(1) the names of the prescription drugs on the list
2	provided by the Health and Human Services Commission as required by
3	<u>Section 562.252;</u>
4	(2) the pharmacy's actual retail price for each drug at
5	the listed dosage; and
6	(3) the date of the most recent update to the list.
7	(b) A pharmacy shall update the pharmacy's retail price for
8	each drug on the list at least once a week. This subchapter does not
9	prevent a pharmacy from changing the current retail price of a drug
10	at any time, provided the listed price is updated at least once a
11	week to reflect the new retail price.
12	(c) A pharmacy shall provide the pharmacy's prescription
13	drug retail price list to consumers on request.
14	(d) The prescription drug retail price list must include an
15	advisory statement prepared by the Health and Human Services
16	Commission alerting a consumer of the need to tell the consumer's
17	health care practitioner and pharmacist about all the medications
18	the consumer may be taking and to ask the health care practitioner
19	and pharmacist how to avoid any harmful interactions between those
20	medications, if any.
21	(e) This section does not apply to a Class E pharmacy.
22	SECTION 3. (a) The Health and Human Services Commission
23	shall adopt rules required by Section 531.093, Government Code, as
24	added by this Act, not later than November 1, 2007.
25	(b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall
26	establish the drug retail price registry required by Section
27	531.093, Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than

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SECTION 4. A pharmacy subject to the requirements of this Act shall compile the prescription drug retail price list required by Subchapter F, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, not later than March 1, 2008, and shall provide the list to consumers on and after that date.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
