4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 26, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 26.014 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 26.014. FAILURE TO ATTEND PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCE.
8	(a) A parent of a student commits an offense if:
9	(1) the parent receives written notice by certified
LO	mail of at least three proposed dates from which the parent car
L1	choose for scheduling a parent-teacher conference between the
L2	parent and the student's teacher;
L3	(2) the parent:
L4	(A) fails to respond to the notice; or
L5	(B) schedules a parent-teacher conference on one
L6	of the dates proposed in the notice or on an alternative date agreed
L7	to by the parent and teacher and fails to:
L8	(i) attend the scheduled conference; or
L9	(ii) before the scheduled conference,
20	notify the teacher or an administrator of the campus to which the
21	teacher is assigned that the parent will be unable to attend the

23	(3) in the case of a student with more than one parent,
24	another parent of the student does not attend a parent-teacher

- 1 conference scheduled in accordance with this subsection.
- 2 (b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 3 (c) An offense under this section may be prosecuted in a
- 4 court in which an offense under Section 25.094(b) may be
- 5 <u>prosecuted.</u>
- 6 (d) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this
- 7 section that the parent had a reasonable excuse for failing to
- 8 attend the parent-teacher conference.
- 9 (e) The clerk of the court in which an offense under this
- 10 section is prosecuted shall transfer the proceeds of any fine
- 11 collected by the court under this section to the school district
- 12 that employs the teacher with whom the parent was scheduled to meet
- in the parent-teacher conference. The district may use funds
- 14 collected under this section only to:
- 15 <u>(1) provide additional compensation to classroom</u>
- 16 teachers in the district; or
- 17 (2) purchase school supplies other than textbooks as
- defined by Section 31.002.
