13	(1) request or reject the use of any or all modalities
14	to relieve the pain;
15	(2) choose from appropriate pharmacologic treatment
16	options to relieve the pain, including opiate medications, without
17	first having to submit to surgery or a medical procedure that
18	results in the destruction of a nerve or other body tissue or the
19	implantation of a drug delivery system or device; and
20	(3) ask the patient's physician to provide an
21	identifying notice of a prescription to treat the pain for purposes
22	of emergency treatment or law enforcement identification.

- 5 SECTION 3. Section 107.001, Occupations Code, is repealed.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
