A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Section 161.056, Agriculture Code, is amended by |
| 6 | amending Subsections (a), (c), (d), and (e) and adding Subsections |
| 7 | (a-1), (j), and (k) to read as follows: |

- (a) In order to provide for disease control and enhance the ability to trace disease-infected animals or animals that have been exposed to disease, the commission may develop and implement a voluntary [an] animal identification program that is, to the extent required by federal law, consistent with the United States Department of Agriculture's National Animal Identification System.
- 14 <u>(a-1)</u> A person may apply for the program by submitting an
 15 <u>annual fee determined by the commission and a signed application</u>
 16 <u>prescribed by the commission.</u> An application form prescribed by
 17 the commission must include the following information:
- 18 <u>(1) a conspicuous notice that the program is</u>
 19 voluntary;
- 20 (2) a disclosure of the types of information collected 21 under the program; and
- 22 (3) notice of the persons to which information the 23 commission collects under the program may be disclosed.
- 24 (c) The commission may permit [require] the use of official

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- 1 identification numbers assigned as part of the animal
- 2 identification program for [animal disease control, animal
- 3 emergency management, and] other commission programs.
- 4 (d) The commission may [establish a date by which all
- 5 premises must be registered and may assess a registration fee on
- 6 all entities that register for a premises identification number.
- 7 (e) Information collected by the commission under this
- 8 section is exempt from the public disclosure requirements of
- 9 Chapter 552, Government Code. The commission may provide
- 10 information to another person, including a governmental entity,
- 11 without altering the confidential status of the information. The
- 12 commission may release information to the following persons if the
- 13 commission determines that the person has adequate protections for
- 14 the confidentiality of the information:
- 15 (1) a person who owns or controls animals and seeks
- 16 information regarding those animals, if the person requests the
- 17 information in writing;
- 18 (2) the attorney general's office, for the purpose of
- 19 law enforcement;
- 20 (3) the secretary of the United States Department of
- 21 Agriculture, for the purpose of animal health protection;
- 22 (4) the secretary of the Department of Homeland
- 23 Security, for the purpose of homeland security;
- 24 (5) the Department of State Health Services, for the
- 25 purpose of protecting the public health from zoonotic diseases;
- 26 (6) any person, under an order of a court of competent
- 27 jurisdiction; or

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- 1 (7) a state, municipal, or county emergency management 2 authority, for the purpose of management or response to natural or
- 3 man-made disasters[+ or
- 4 [(8) any person the executive director of the
- 5 commission considers appropriate, if the executive director
- 6 determines that:
- 7 [(A) livestock may be threatened by a disease,
- 8 agent, or pest; and
- 9 [(B) the release of the information is related to
- 10 actions the commission may take under this section].
- 11 (j) A person who participates in the program may withdraw
- 12 from the program at any time. The commission shall delete from the
- 13 program all personal information relating to a participant when the
- 14 participant withdraws from the program.
- (k) A person may not condition a service, benefit, license,
- 16 payment, or permit on participation in a program under this
- 17 section.
- SECTION 2. Sections 161.056(g) and (h), Agriculture Code,
- 19 are repealed.
- 20 SECTION 3. The Texas Animal Health Commission shall:
- 21 (1) not later than November 1, 2007, provide notice of
- 22 the provisions of this Act to each person registered on the
- 23 effective date of this Act under Section 161.056, Agriculture Code,
- 24 and provide the person with the opportunity to withdraw from the
- 25 program; and
- 26 (2) not later than January 1, 2008, adopt rules as
- 27 required by Section 161.056, Agriculture Code, as amended by this

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- 1 Act.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
