residential treatment, including medical and nursing services,

designed to reduce a patient's acute symptoms of mental illness and

prevent a patient's admission to an inpatient mental health

Kerrville State Hospital to provide food service, laundry service,

lawn care, and equipment rental to the crisis stabilization unit.

(c) The local mental health authority shall contract with

- 4 (d) The crisis stabilization unit may not be used to provide

- 9 <u>(e) The local mental health authority operating the crisis</u>

- operating the 16-bed unit, the money appropriated to the department
- 12 for operating 16 beds in state hospitals that is allocated to the
- 13 <u>local mental health authority.</u> The department shall ensure that
- 14 the local mental health authority retains the remainder of the

- operating the 16-bed unit. The department may allocate additional

- 19 (f) The department shall reduce the number of beds the

- that the 16 beds in the crisis stabilization unit are made available

- 6 (h) This section expires September 1, 2009.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
