A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the sharing of client information among certain state
3	agencies.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2060 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2060. INTERAGENCY SHARING OF INFORMATION
8	Sec. 2060.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "participating
9	agency" means:
10	(1) the Health and Human Services Commission;
11	(2) the Department of State Health Services;
12	(3) the Department of Family and Protective Services;
13	(4) the Department of Aging and Disability Services;
14	(5) the Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative
15	Services;
16	(6) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
17	(7) the Texas Workforce Commission;
18	(8) the Texas Education Agency;
19	(9) the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission;
20	(10) the Texas Youth Commission;
21	(11) the Office of Rural Community Affairs;
22	(12) the Texas Veterans Commission; and
23	(13) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
24	Affairs.

- 1 <u>Sec. 2060.002. SHARING OF INFORMATION AMONG CERTAIN</u>
 2 AGENCIES. (a) This section applies only to information held by or
- 3 for a participating agency that relates to an individual who
- 4 receives or has received social services, mental health services,
- 5 substance abuse services, or health services from that agency.
- 6 (b) The participating agencies shall coordinate the
- 7 agencies' information systems to allow for the sharing of
- 8 information to:
- 9 (1) facilitate the communication of the information
- 10 across agency lines and jurisdictional boundaries;
- 11 (2) identify and coordinate the provision of necessary
- 12 services to an individual; and
- 13 (3) evaluate programs to assess the overall efficiency
- 14 and efficacy of services delivered by the participating agencies.
- (c) On request of the Interagency Coordinating Council for
- 16 Data Sharing or on its own initiative, a state agency not listed in
- 17 Section 2060.001 that funds, regulates, or provides a service
- described by Subsection (a), or whose costs or outcome measures are
- 19 affected by the provision of any of those services, may choose to
- 20 coordinate its database and share information with the
- 21 participating agencies for the purposes authorized by this chapter.
- 22 (d) Confidential information shared under this section
- 23 remains subject to the same confidentiality requirements and legal
- 24 restrictions on access to the information that are imposed by law on
- 25 the state agency that originally obtained or collected the
- 26 information.
- (e) Information may be shared under this section without the

- 1 consent of the person who is the subject of the information.
- 2 Sec. 2060.003. INTERAGENCY COORDINATING COUNCIL FOR DATA
- 3 SHARING. (a) The Interagency Coordinating Council for Data
- 4 Sharing is composed of:
- 5 (1) a public member with knowledge and expertise in
- 6 the provision or delivery of social services, mental health
- 7 services, substance abuse services, or health services, appointed
- 8 by the governor;
- 9 (2) the executive director of the Department of
- 10 <u>Information Resources or that person's designee;</u>
- 11 (3) the executive head of each of the participating
- 12 agencies or that person's designee; and
- 13 (4) the executive head of each state agency, if any,
- 14 that chooses to share information with the participating agencies
- under Section 2060.002(c) or that person's designee.
- 16 (b) The public member of the council serves a two-year term
- 17 expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year and serves as the
- 18 presiding officer of the council.
- 19 (c) The council shall meet at least quarterly at the call of
- 20 the presiding officer.
- 21 (d) Service on the council by a state officer or employee is
- 22 an additional duty of the member's office or employment. A member
- of the council is not entitled to compensation for service on the
- 24 <u>council</u> but is entitled to reimbursement of travel expenses
- 25 <u>incurred by the member while conducting the business of the</u>
- council, as provided by Chapter 660 and the General Appropriations
- 27 Act.

- 1 (e) The agencies represented on the council shall provide
 2 the staff and administrative support necessary for the council to
 3 perform its duties.
- 4 (f) The council shall adopt appropriate policies and procedures designed to facilitate the interagency coordination of 5 6 information systems required by Section 2060.002, including the 7 creation of standards for sharing information electronically under appropriate controls to ensure that confidential information 8 remains confidential. Each participating agency and each state 9 agency that chooses to share information under Section 2060.002(c) 10 shall comply with the policies and procedures adopted by the 11 12 council under this subsection.
- (g) The presiding officer of the council may appoint
 subcommittees consisting of members of the council for any purpose
 consistent with the duties of the council under this section.

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- (h) Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, each participating agency and each state agency that chooses to share information under Section 2060.002(c) shall report to the council regarding the agency's implementation of the policies and procedures adopted under Subsection (f).
- 21 <u>(i) A state agency shall cooperate with the council in the</u> 22 performance of its duties.
- Sec. 2060.004. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than

 December 1 of each even-numbered year, the Interagency Coordinating

 Council for Data Sharing shall evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of the information sharing system established under this chapter and report its findings to the legislature.

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1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
