- SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Labor Code, is amended by adding 5 Subchapter G to read as follows: 6
- SUBCHAPTER G. PAYMENT OF WAGES FOR WORK MISSED DUE TO JURY DUTY 7
- Sec. 61.151. APPLICATION. (a) This subchapter applies to 8
- an employer and employee as described by Chapter 122, Civil 9
- Practice and Remedies Code. 10
- 11 (b) This subchapter does not apply to a self-employed 12 person.
- Sec. 61.152. EMPLOYEE ENTITLED TO PAYMENT. An employee is 13
- 14 entitled to payment as provided by this chapter for employment
- missed on the first day required of the employee while answering a 15
- summons for jury duty in any court of the United States or this 16

- Sec. 61.153. WAGE PAYMENT PROCESS. (a) An employee who 18
- receives a summons to report for jury duty shall provide a copy of 19
- the summons to the employee's employer. 20
- 21 (b) An employer shall pay an employee the employee's usual
- compensation, not to exceed \$40, for the first day that the employee 22
- 23 responds to the jury summons or any part of that first day that

- 2 <u>employee under this section.</u>
- 3 (c) An employer is not required under this section to
- 4 compensate an employee for more time than was actually spent by the
- 5 employee in answering the summons for jury duty.
- 6 Sec. 61.154. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- 7 offense if the person is a private employer and the person violates
- 8 Section 61.152 or 61.153.
- 9 (b) An offense under this section is a Class B misdemeanor.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
