## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the Commission for Affordable and Accessible Health
- 3 Benefit Plan Coverage.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "commission" means the
- 6 Commission for Affordable and Accessible Health Benefit Plan
- 7 Coverage established under Section 2 of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 2. COMMISSION; COMPOSITION. (a) Not later than the
- 9 60th day after the effective date of this Act, the governor shall
- 10 appoint a Commission for Affordable and Accessible Health Benefit
- 11 Plan Coverage. The governor shall determine the size of the
- 12 commission.
- 13 (b) The commission must include at least one member selected
- 14 from a list of persons nominated by the speaker of the house of
- 15 representatives and at least one member selected from a list of
- 16 persons nominated by the lieutenant governor.
- 17 (c) The commission must include individuals with expertise
- in areas related to health care and health benefit plan coverage and
- 19 may include representantives of:
- 20 (1) insurers, health maintenance organizations, or
- 21 other health benefit plan issuers;
- 22 (2) physicians, hospitals, or other health care
- 23 providers;
- 24 (3) providers of health care services under Medicaid,

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- 1 the state child health plan, and other public health care programs,
- 2 including providers of indigent care under Chapter 61, Health and
- 3 Safety Code; and
- 4 (4) employers and businesses.
- 5 (d) The commission may include representatives of the Texas
- 6 Department of Insurance, the Health and Human Services Commission,
- 7 and other affected state agencies.
- 8 (e) The commission must include at least one representative
- 9 of consumers of health care and health benefit plan coverage.
- 10 SECTION 3. CHAIRPERSON. The governor shall designate a
- 11 member of the commission to serve as chairperson of the commission.
- 12 SECTION 4. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. The Texas Department of
- 13 Insurance shall provide administrative support services to the
- 14 commission.
- 15 SECTION 5. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES. A
- 16 member of the commission serves without compensation but is
- 17 entitled to reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in the
- 18 performance of official commission duties from funds appropriated
- 19 to the Texas Department of Insurance.
- 20 SECTION 6. STUDY. (a) The commission shall study
- 21 alternative methods, including innovative programs implemented or
- 22 under consideration in other states, to make health benefit plan
- 23 coverage affordable for, and accessible to, as many residents of
- 24 this state as is practicable.
- 25 (b) As part of the study conducted by the commission, the
- 26 commission may conduct hearings in locations throughout the state
- 27 to gather information.

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- 1 SECTION 7. REPORT; RECOMMENDATION; PROPOSED LEGISLATION.
- 2 (a) The commission shall prepare a report identifying alternative
- 3 methods to increase the affordability and accessibility of health
- 4 benefit plan coverage in this state.
- 5 (b) The report must include the commission's recommendation
- 6 concerning:
- 7 (1) a program or system to make coverage affordable
- 8 for, and accessible to, as many residents of this state as is
- 9 practicable; and
- 10 (2) whether the program or system should specify:
- 11 (A) the minimum benefits that are to be provided
- 12 under the coverage; and
- 13 (B) the types and amounts of cost-sharing
- 14 provisions, such as deductibles and copayments, that should be
- 15 included in the coverage.
- 16 (c) The report may include alternative proposals and
- 17 proposed pilot projects.
- 18 (d) The commission's report must include proposals for any
- 19 legislation necessary to implement the commission's
- 20 recommendations.
- (e) Not later than September 1, 2008, the commission shall
- 22 submit the report to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker
- 23 of the house of represenatives.
- 24 SECTION 8. COMMISSION ABOLISHED; EXPIRATION OF ACT. The
- commission is abolished and this Act expires June 1, 2009.
- 26 SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 27 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members

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- 1 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 2 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 3 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
