## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the employment of school district peace officers and
- 3 the enforcement of certain violations under a student code of
- 4 conduct.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 37.081(a), (f), and (h), Education
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The board of trustees of <u>an independent</u> [any] school
- 9 district may employ security personnel and may commission peace
- 10 officers to carry out this subchapter. If a board of trustees
- 11 authorizes a person employed as security personnel to carry a
- 12 weapon, the person must be a commissioned peace officer. The
- 13 jurisdiction of a peace officer or security personnel under this
- 14 section shall be determined by the board of trustees and may include
- 15 all territory in the boundaries of the school district and all
- 16 property outside the boundaries of the district that is owned,
- 17 leased, or rented by or otherwise under the control of the school
- 18 district and the board of trustees that employ the peace officer or
- 19 security personnel.
- 20 (f) The chief of police of the school district police
- 21 department shall be accountable to the superintendent and shall
- 22 report to the superintendent or to the assistant, associate, or
- 23 deputy superintendent designated by the superintendent
- 24 [superintendent's designee]. School district police officers

- shall be supervised by the chief of police of the school district or
- 2 <u>a police officer designated by</u> the chief of police. School district
- 3 police officers must [police's designee and shall] be licensed by
- 4 the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education.
- 5 (h) [A peace officer assigned to duty and commissioned under
- 6 this section shall take and file the oath required of peace officers
- 7 and shall execute and file a bond in the sum of \$1,000, payable to
- 8 the board of trustees, with two or more sureties, conditioned that
- 9 the peace officer will fairly, impartially, and faithfully perform
- 10 all the duties that may be required of the peace officer by law. The
- 11 bond may be sued on in the name of any person injured until the whole
- 12 amount of the bond is recovered. Any peace officer commissioned
- 13 under this section must meet all minimum standards for peace
- officers established by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer
- 15 Standards and Education.
- SECTION 2. Section 37.102, Education Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- (d) Subsection (c) does not apply to conduct by a student
- 19 that violates the student code of conduct if the conduct is not an
- 20 offense under other law or under a specific rule adopted by the
- 21 board of trustees under this subchapter.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
